Fête de Montréal: Quartier des Spectacles celebrates the city's creativity!

Montreal, May 7, 2013 – On May 17, Quartier des Spectacles will host its third annual Fête de Montréal. To mark the 371st anniversary of the city's founding, the Quartier will present a full day of activities celebrating culture in all its forms. From 11:30 a.m. to late at night, Sainte-Catherine Street, Place des Festivals, the Place des Arts Esplanade and Promenade des Artistes will be a festive zone filled with performances, street food and digital art.

This year's major new activity is a unique show combining video projections and live music, showcasing the talent of Montreal-based artists. Five multimedia studios were invited to create an architectural mapping work to be projected on Théâtre Maisonneuve at Place des Arts. Inspired by songs with Montreal themes, the creations will be set to live performances by musicians paired with the multimedia artists for the occasion. Starting at 9:30 p.m., this special event will feature Ariane Moffatt + Geodezik // Yann Perreau & Jérôme Minière + Turbine // Louis-Jean Cormier + Eltoro Studio // Plaster + Champagne Club Sandwich // Poirier & Boogat + Baillart Cardell & Fils.

Earlier in the day, the public is invited to an exciting cultural street party. From 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. and from 4:30 p.m. onward, some 125 artists will perform in 11 different zones in the Place des Arts area. Five of the zones will feature unique events: Armand Vaillancourt will paint with the public; Les Productions Haut-Vol (T-Wall trampoline); auto-fiction by Human Playground; and Les 7 doigts de la main with the TNM. Meanwhile, the six other zones will offer something different every 15 minutes. Surprises are quaranteed!

Your taste buds are also in for a treat: at lunchtime and starting at 2:30 p.m., nine food trucks* will serve up their specialties, from tartare to meatballs to lobster rolls. Come out for Happy Hour in Place des Festivals and on Sainte-Catherine Street, which will, for an evening, be the city's biggest *terrasse*. Starting at 7 p.m., DJs will spin records to get the crowd up and dancing. From 10 to 11 p.m., the DJs will be joined by VJ Chocobeets.
